

BABY CHEVRON QUILT - 33" x 44"

This kit contains 9" squares - 12 are Novelty fabrics and 12 are plain (solid) fabric.

You will be making half-square triangles [HSTs] with a special method* corners. Sew down all four sides, using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam. Press the square to "set" the seam. Sew and press all 12 squares.

Place a long ruler diagonally across a sewn square from corner to corner. Cut one diagonal and then the other. You will have 4 triangles. Press them open with the dark side on top. These are the HSTs for your quilt top. [NOTE: These triangles have outside bias edges, so be gentle in handling them.]

Following the illustration, lay out the triangles in three chevron pattern rows. Use any combination you like, but scatter the prints around so there aren't two identical triangles next to each other.

Sew the HSTs into rows; sew the rows together, matching the seams. Press the top. The top is complete and should measure $33" \times 44"$

Layer the quilt top, backing and batting. Quilt it as desired, but no less than 6" apart because baby quilts have to hold up to frequent washing. Sew on label.
