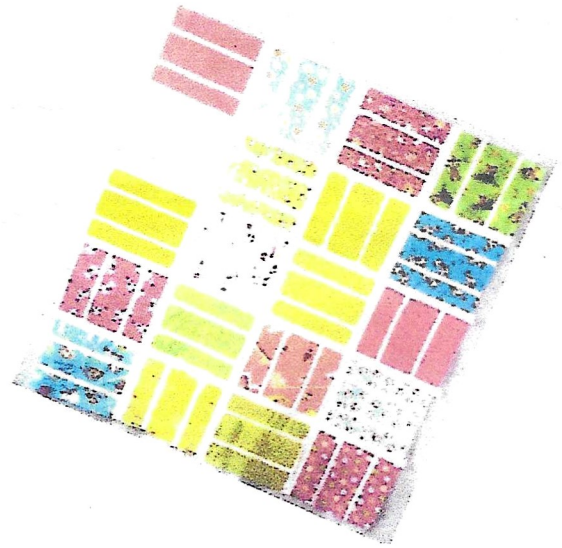


CRISS-CROSS BABY QUILT - 36" X 44"



The kit contains:

20 $8\frac{1}{2}$ " squares

White fabric for sashing (27" x 42")

Backing fabric

Cut the white fabric as follows:

2 $8\frac{1}{2}$ " strips - width of fabric. Cross-cut into 40 1 " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " strips and 15 $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $8\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

4 $1\frac{1}{2}$ " strips width of fabric (inner sashing)

Cut each $8\frac{1}{2}$ " square into 3 pieces in this order: $2\frac{1}{2}$ ", $3\frac{1}{2}$ ", $2\frac{1}{2}$ ". Keep the pieces together.

Begin by inserting the 1 " strips into one block - you are actually just putting the block back together. It will end up at $8\frac{1}{2}$ " square again.

When you have reconstructed all the blocks, lay them out in a pleasing pattern, 4 across and 5 down. Then sew the $1\frac{1}{2}$ " strips between the rows. After the rows are joined, insert the long $1\frac{1}{2}$ " strips. [Refer to the illustrated quilt to help you with the construction of the top.]

Your top is finished! Layer your quilt top, batting, and backing. Quilt no farther apart than 6". Sew on the label, bind the quilt, finishing it by hand or machine.
